#### **Position Overview:**

The Community Liaison – Group Facilitator builds community partnerships, leads program outreach and recruitment efforts, and facilitates healing–centered youth groups as part of the *Panche Be Project*. This role is crucial in fostering trust and visibility within Latino/a/e/X and Mayan communities, ensuring that participants and their families engage meaningfully with culturally rooted services.

### **Core Responsibilities:**

- Develop and sustain relationships with community-based organizations, schools, cultural groups, and service providers to foster a collaborative environment.
- Lead culturally based group sessions and support the implementation of rites-of-passage programs.
- Organize and conduct regular outreach efforts, including social media campaigns, school visits, and community events.
- Assist with participant intakes, orientations, and strength-based needs assessments.
- Represent the program at health fairs, forums, community meetings, and wellness events.
- Support planning of graduation ceremonies, cultural events, and healing circles.
- Promote Indigenous and intergenerational approaches to wellness and youth leadership.
- Maintain annual training and continuing education requirements to ensure appropriate care for clients and the workplace

#### **Qualifications:**

- 2+ years of experience in outreach, engagement, or community organizing in Latino/a/e/X or Mayan communities.
- Training or certification in cultural wellness curricula preferred (El Joven Noble, Girasol, etc.) or willingness to obtain.
- Deep knowledge and lived understanding of Latino and Indigenous cultural practices and wellness frameworks.
- Comfort with social media outreach and youth engagement strategies.
- Ability to work flexible hours including evenings and weekends, for outreach and ceremonial activities
