Position Overview:

The Program Lead – Group Facilitator 1 is responsible for the daily operations, administration, and direct service implementation of the *Panche Be Project* for Latino/a/e/X and Mayan youth, ages 12–17. The role integrates program coordination, group facilitation, and youth mentorship grounded in healing-centered, culturally rooted, and strength-based approaches.

Core Responsibilities:

- Oversee day-to-day administration and coordination of youth outpatient program activities-including budget management, food preparation, site coordination, etc.
- Lead youth healing-centered groups using El Joven Noble, Girasol, and La Cultura Cura curricula.
- Conduct youth intakes, non-clinical assessments, and orientation processes.
- Provide van transportation for youth to and from program facilities as needed.
- Ensure compliance with program timelines, reporting deliverables, and data collection protocols.
- Collaborate closely with the Community Liaison and Case Manager to support holistic service delivery.
- Maintain fidelity to Indigenous-based and culturally specific healing practices.
- Organize, attend, and support cultural and ceremonial events.
- Support outreach, recruitment, and community partnerships as needed.
- Maintain annual training and continuing education requirements to ensure appropriate care for clients and the workplace

Qualifications:

- 2-3 years of experience in youth services, group facilitation, or community healing programs.
- Trained and/or Certified in El Joven Noble, Girasol, or related cultural models preferred (or willingness to be certified).

- Experience working with immigrant youth, youth impacted by trauma & resilience and are bilingual or live/ work in bicultural settings.
- Valid California Driver's License and clean driving record.
- Strong organizational and communication skills.
- Ability to work occasional evenings and weekends for events and ceremonies.
